ALL skiers are winners and each receives a medal at the finish line for participation.

Since 1985, Sons of Norway has sponsored the Barnebirkie. Barnebirkie is a children’s cross country ski event associated with the American Birkebeiner Ski Race in Hayward, Wisconsin. Since it’s founding, the Barnebirkie has become the largest children’s

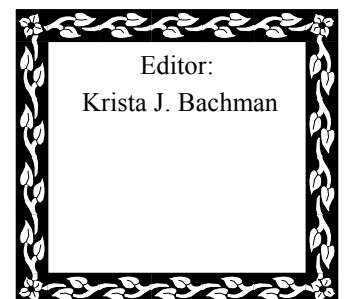
ski event in North America!

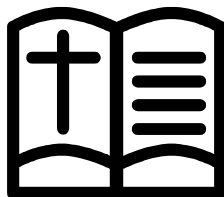

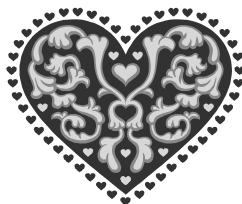

Heritage Fest!

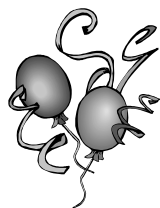

Norwegian Flag Soars into Space!

Catherine G. Coleman ("Cady") was an astronaut on the Columbia STS-33. This voyage into space took place on July 22-27, 1999 and Cady was allowed to bring only two personal items. Cady took the Norwegian flag, and an issue of the Norwegian Astronomical Society's newsletter (next time let's hope she brings a copy of *Skjold News!*)

On Friday, September 17, Cady handed the flag that traveled around world 80 times to Ambassador Tom E. Vraalsen at the Royal Norwegian Embassy. From

there, Vraalsen will take it to His Majesty, King Harald.

Cady became an astronaut in 1992 and her first mission was in 1995. She is a very proud woman and believes she is sending a positive message to aspiring young girls and boys. She was quoted in saying "when they see what I have accomplished, they say: if she can do it-I can".

Her mission was an important one. The main purpose of Columbia's mission was

to send the world's most powerful x-ray telescope into orbit around the world. Over the next five years, the telescope will search for black holes, supernovas and other phenomena that are not visible to the human eye as ordinary light.
